English	Fiction – Text: <i>The Tin Forest</i> Non-fiction – Non-chronological report linked to Bronze Age/Iron Age Poetry - Poem to perform – Text: The sound collector	Fiction - Adventure and Mystery Text -The Lost Happy Endings Poetry : Shapes and Calligrams linked to Spring

Science	Rocks, Soils and Fossils The children will identify different types of rocks and those that are found in the local area. They will explore how fossils are created and then will investigate the importance of soil.	Movement/Nutrition and Diet: Children will work scientifically to learn about food and their bodies. They will learn about the function of joints and how we move, different food groups and the importance of having a healthy and balanced diet.

Art	Growing Artists. The children will be exploring composition and scale to create an abstract drawing.
